

**PUBLIC NOTICE OF CHANGE IN RATES WITHOUT
PROPOSED EFFECTIVE DATES**
(Tariff Form 8-A)

NOTICE is hereby given that Jefferson Utilities, Inc., a public utility, has on April 11, 2008 filed with the PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION OF WEST VIRGINIA, an application containing increased rates, tolls and charges for furnishing water service to approximately 2,153 customers served by Jefferson Utilities' water systems located in Jefferson County, West Virginia, including Walnut Grove, Meadowbrook, Shenandoah Junction, Bardane, Keys Ferry Acres, Westridge Hills, Deerfield, and Harpers Ferry Campsites. No increase is requested for Meadowbrook customers.

The proposed increased rates and charges will produce approximately \$699,078 annually in additional revenue, an increase of approximately 64%, plus approximately \$176,235 annually in surcharge revenues. The average monthly bill for the various classes of customers will be changed as follows:

The increases shown are based on averages of all customers in the indicated class. Each class may receive an increase or decrease greater or less than stated here. Individual customers may receive increases that are greater or less than average. Furthermore, the requested rates and charges are only a proposal and are subject to change (increases or decreases) by the Public Service Commission in its review of this filing. Any increase in rates and charges will not become effective until authorized and approved by the Public Service Commission. (If a hearing is conducted, notice will be given of the time and place of hearing.)

Anyone desiring to protest or intervene should file a written protest or petition to intervene prior to May 31, 2008 unless otherwise modified by Commission order. Failure to timely protest or intervene can affect your rights to protest any rate increases and to participate in future proceedings. All protests or requests to intervene should briefly state the reason for the protest or intervention. Requests to intervene must comply with the Commission's rules on intervention set forth in the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.
